The food bank helps local individuals and families in crisis through the provision of emergency food supplies donated by churches, schools, businesses and the general public. The circumstances surrounding a crisis are unique to every individual, so the food bank partners with frontline care professionals, such as health visitors, social workers and other community-based support workers, who are able to identify people facing hunger and refer them to the food bank. As well as receiving nutritionally-balanced three day food parcels, people are welcomed with a cup of tea, listened to and sign posted to agencies that are able to help resolve the underlying cause of their crisis. Last year The Handsworth Foodbank distributed just under 103,000.00kg of food to local people in crisis.

On Wednesday 15th October Mrs Saunders and some of our Year 6 children will be delivering an assembly talking to the children about what happens to the food you kindly donate and how this helps.

We are asking that your child brings any items you wish to donate into the academy from Monday 13th October. Once in the academy we will collect all donated items together where they will then be collected and taken to the foodbank after our assembly on Wednesday.

We are always overwhelmed by your generous donations every year- your contributions really do make a difference.
