Dear parents/carers,

Hello again! Welcome to the Summer term in Nursery. For some children this will be the last term before going through to 'big school' whilst for others, it still feels like their very first steps in nursery.

So this last term is split into two parts with a week off in the middle. We will be focusing a LOT on natural things including animals (big and small) and plants. The current curriculum in Nursery has a section all about the world. For children aged 30-50 months old, they need to understand the following state-

- Comments and asks questions about aspects of their familiar world such as the place where they live or the natural world.
- Can talk about some of the things they have observed such as plants, animals, natural and found objects.
- Talks about why things happen and how things work.
- Developing an understanding of growth, decay and changes over time.
- Shows care and concern for living things and the environment.
