

Hello and welcome to Birley Primary Academy. We can't wait to welcome you to our nursery in September! We have a lovely newly refurbished building with amazing toys and resources for your children to learn and explore with.

Our topic when we start in September is called '**Happy, Healthy Me**'. In this topic we will focus on a range of stories including; Goldilocks and the Three Bears, The Three Billy Goats Gruff, Jack and the Beanstalk, The little Red Hen, Owl Babies, The Tiger Who Came to Tea, Peace at Last and Funny Bones. We will be focusing on learning The Little Red Hen through Talk4writing. This involves the children hearing the story and developing actions to help them retell the story themselves using their actions. We will also spend time in play encouraging sharing, taking turns and making new relationships. Below are the things we will be learning and working towards this term.

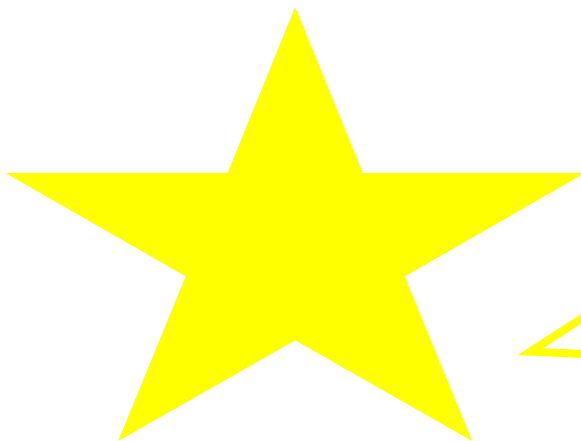
