Understanding how to manipulate objects by rolling or squeezing them. For example, using playdough. Gross Motor Skills: Confidently stopping when moving around the environment. Developing hand– eye coordination. Choosing and uses the right resources to carry out their own plan.

Noticing patterns and arranging our own patterns. 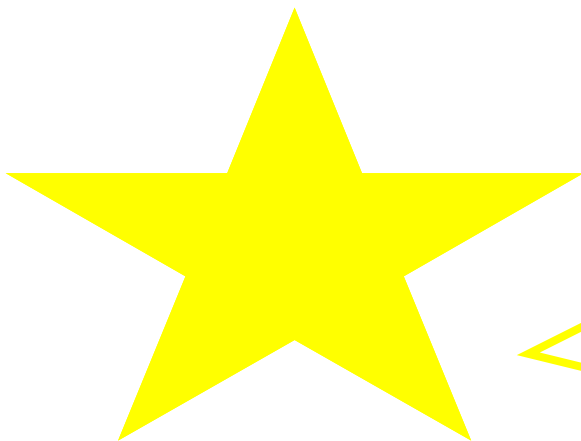


We Love To Play

We ask that you provide your child with a bag and spare set of clothes that are clearly labelled (including shoes).

Reminders

- Please put sun cream and a hat on your child before they come to school on a sunny day.
- Please wrap your child up warm on cold winter days.
